DID YOU KNOW?

There is software in schools to 'filter' sites that are inappropriate for you to use.

Emails you send are not private! Your teacher or an administrator can view them.

Files you save on computer equipment in schools are not private! Your teacher or an administrator can view them.

Anything you publish on the Internet can be viewed by anybody! Including... your parents, teachers, and future employers. Think about what you want them to see!

Inappropriate use of Internet outside school can still be dealt with by your school.

If you damage computer equipment or software in your school you are responsible for any damage.
